English as a Foreign Language - 2012/2013

General English

The General English course is **15 hours per week delivered in the morning**. You will learn English through a balance of activities aimed at improving your grammar, vocabulary, pronunciation and the skills of reading, writing, speaking and listening. Throughout your programme there will be a strong emphasis on English for Communication. You can also prepare for Cambridge exams at an appropriate level. You will be given a course book for your core English classes which is included in your tuition fee. You must bring it with you to each class. You will be given an initial assessment to determine which class is most suitable to develop your level and understanding of English. The initial assessment will cover all the skills. You will be given homework and class tests at regular intervals in order to assess and monitor your progress. Mornings are divided into two classes. The first class starts at 9.15am and finishes at 10.45am. The second class starts at 11.00am and ends at 12.30pm. The programme has been designed to ensure that every student follows a course of study suitable for their level of competence in English. Minimum study period is 2 weeks.

English Extra

You can also develop your English Language ability and then learn new skills to put your language into practice. You can choose 1 or 2 extra subjects in addition to your General English classes. Each option is five hours per week. Subjects are studied in the afternoon between 13.30 and 16.15. One subject is two afternoons of 2.5 hours each. You can choose a maximum of 2 subjects from a range of options which can include:

All courses are subject to minimum class size and are subject to change at any time. Available courses will depend on your level of English and specific courses cannot be guaranteed.

The course fees DO NOT include airport transfers, accommodation or living costs, any additional examinations or any part time courses you choose to take. All fees to be paid in full, in advance inclusive of £1000 deposit. Included in your tuition fees is access to Burlington English. This is a unique on-line interactive study course which you can use in preparation for your studies at Chichester College or in conjunction with your studies at College. Burlington English, encourage your fluency and confidence, develop your reading and listening skills and also teach and reinforce grammar and vocabulary. Important Information

The minimum age that students will be accepted for study is 16. A full social programme is available to all international students. Many of its activities are free of charge, however, the programme of full day Saturday excursions will be at an additional cost for each trip.

Information for Students requiring a Student Visa

You must have an English ability at level B1 or above on the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR) to study with an Adult Student Visa. You cannot study an English course with a Child Student Visa. If you have a level of English below B1 on the CEFR you may study with a Student Visitor Visa for up to 6 months.

How to join us

Please send your fully completed Application and Accommodation Forms to the College with a copy of the relevant pages of your passport, copies of your qualifications and your English certificate, and your tuition fee deposit. For further information and details of tuition fee deposits please see the separate sheet HOW TO APPLY.

On receipt of all of the above we will send you a Confirmation of Acceptance of Studies letter (CAS) or Student Visitor Visa Letter which can be used to apply for your student visa, and accommodation reservation details if requested. You or your agent should inform the College as soon as your visa has been issued and confirm time of arrival, and complete an airport transfer form if required. In the case of host families, details may not be available at the time of application, but will be given to you at least two weeks before your arrival date.

Should you be found to have provided false information or false documents to the College in order to receive a Visa Letter or Confirmation of Acceptance of Studies (CAS) and have been refused a visa on these grounds, the College reserves the right not to refund any payments made.

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
